Dear Mr McMorrow,

Thank you for your request of 24th June 2015 under the Freedom of Information Act (2000). Your exact request was:

"Do the PHSO have the remit and or power to investigate a Dr breaching the DPA?"

I can confirm that the Department holds this information. Where a breach of the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA) is suspected, then a complaint should first be made through the complaints process of the NHS organisation concerned. Where the complainant is dissatisfied with the outcome of the complaint then it may be forwarded to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) to investigate. However, the ICO will only consider the complaint in the context of the provisions of the DPA – and will not consider whether there has been a breach of the Common Law in respect of the duty of confidentiality. Where the ICO has been unable to determine whether there has been a breach of the common law duty of confidentiality, the complainant may consider asking the Parliamentary and Health Service Ombudsman (PSHO) to investigate.

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review. Internal review requests should be submitted within two months of the date of receipt of the response to your original letter and should be addressed to:
